We are delighted to announce that Swan Lane First School has achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the 2018/19 academic year. The School Games Mark is a Government led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

We attended 17 different sporting events this year, with a total of 130 young people competing in local inter-school competitions. This included I pupil attending the National Cross Country Championships in Leicester. We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible.

To end the academic year, 355 pupils and 28 staff took part in a round robin sports event to celebrate another fantastic year of school sport! As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, work force and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year. The children placed crosses on the graves and noted the ages of some of those who died. Many were only 19 years old.
