Year 5 - Germany





Year 4 recently visited Winchcombe train station for an evacuee experience. Dressed as children from the 1940s, we arrived filled with excitement, with some children about to embark on their first ever train journey. We boarded a steam train, and sang wartime songs to keep spirits high. A German spy was spotted by the children, so Mr Warren & Mrs Smith swiftly dealt with him. After that, we had the chance to speak to some fascinating





using fire-fighting equipment from the 1940s before dashing to the shelter as the siren sounded. The children really enjoyed the trip, it has significantly helped them in understanding life during the war, and it has been fantastic to see the children beginning to empathise with those children who were involved with evacuation during WWII.
