
Finally, we would like to thank our Teaching Assistants, Mrs Whitehouse and Mrs Dyers, for all of their tireless work behind the scenes.



## Million Dots Challenge

It has taken several weeks, but the children across the school have managed to draw 1,000,000 dots between them. Well done to everyone who completed a sheet, including children, staff and parents. The children really rose to the challenge.

L+W won the competition to complete the most sheets as a class, with 227,000 dots drawn between them. IP, 3J and 4M also managed more than IOO,000 dots each. Mrs Mullaly was the staff member who

drew the most dots as she managed 20,000 by herself! It was also great to see some beautiful designs including fantastic patterns, symmetrical images and even messages written using dots. Katryn Grout and Freya

Goodlad produced some fantastic working, estimating that it would take over 5 days for one person to draw 1,000,000 dots by themselves, which shows

that team work is much better!

This week we displayed the 1,000,000 dots. The year 5 children helped to lay them out in the hall and the sheets did fit in quite comfortably. Every class was then able to come and look at the dots and try to find their own sheets. It was a wonderful piece of maths work and also an excellent work of modern art! It should have given the children a greater sense of the scale of the numbers we use every day in maths.
