Welcome to our first newsletter of 2017! We have already been back at school for almost four weeks, so there is much to update you on.

A Note on Attendance

I would like to remind all parents and carers about the position the school is in when granting leave of absence.

The granting of leave of absence in school term time is, by law, a matter for consideration and decision by the school. There is no automatic right to any leave in term time. The Department for Education (DfE) and Worcestershire County Council (WCC) policy is that family holidays should not be taken in school term time. Where such requests are made, in order for the leave to be granted, the Headteacher must decide if there are exceptional circumstances.

Should the school decide **not to grant leave of absence** and parents/carers still take their child out of school the absence will be recorded as **unauthorised** which

may be subject to an initial Holiday Penalty Notice fine of £60 per parent per child.

At Swan Lane First School we are constantly working hard to improve the attendance of the children. We have a weekly class attendance award and at the end of the academic year, children who have managed to achieve 100% attendance, are rewarded with a badge and a certificate. The Data Leader and office staff meet weekly with the Education Welfare Officer to look at attendance in detail. Last year we managed to achieve an attendance level of 96.2% so this year our target is 96.3%. We ask for your help in achieving this target by making sure that your child/children are in school when they are well enough to attend.
