nformation on the Website

Mr Bowkett and Mrs Whitehouse maintain the school's website and it is updated on a weekly basis. Forthcoming events appear on the home page and it is possible to access the calendar pages for events that are happening during the rest of the academic year. It is impossible for us to upload all of the letters that are sent home, simply due to time constraints. However, if we run any competitions which require a template or there are application forms for the children to complete we will

put these on the website as requested.

There are details on the website of the curriculum your child will be following in each of the year groups. Details of the Numeracy and Literacy topics can be found under "Learning." You then need to click on the year group on the right hand side and here you will find information for Maths and Big Writing. An overview of the whole curriculum and topics that will be taught throughout the year in all other areas can be found on the left hand side of this page under "Curriculum." You can find examples of the Big Maths "Learn It" Sheets and there will soon be examples of the "CLIC Sheets"

Homework

The response to this statement was very mixed. Some parents want more homework, some parents believe it is the right amount of homework and others want less homework. We expect every child to read at home every night. Children from Year I upwards have a spelling test each week. There are the Big Maths "Learn Its" which the children should be learning every week and there are the Big Writing homework slips which go home with suggestions and ideas of things that could be completed at home to help the child with their writing on Friday. As a school, we believe we have the balance right with homework as we also want the children to have time to en joy activities and clubs outside the school

We are looking to improve our spelling homework. Each class teacher will make sure the children have a week to learn their spellings. No new spellings will be given out as homework until the previous ones have been tested.

School Security

We have worked hard to make our site as secure as possible. There is now a wooden fence surrounding the playground by the entrance to the school. The

fencing down the side of the field, which forms a boundary with St Mary's Road, was replaced last summer. There are extra security measures planned during the working day for the entrance to the school and once the building work at the back of the school is completed, additional fencing will be placed by the Year I classroom to prevent easy access to the rear of the school. We feel we have the balance right between keeping the children safe but also maintaining the school as one that is welcoming and accessible to all.

Lunch Times

There are fourteen Lunchtime Supervisors employed at the school. They spend their time looking after the children in the dining hall, where they encourage the children to eat as much of their lunch as possible, and they supervise the children when they are outside at play. Two members of the Leadership Team are also on duty every lunchtime.

Post Box

There has been a request for a secure box in the foyer area of school where envelopes and forms can be posted very well. Their main concern at the school is that the so parents/carers don't have to wait in a queue for the School Office when all they want to do is hand something in. This is a good idea and something we will consider.

Playground Plan

On the first day back in September, parents would find it useful to have a plan which shows where the children need to line up on the first morning back and where to collect them at the end of the day. We will send this information out on a newsletter at the end of this academic year and also put details on the

We will endeavour to provide more notice of trips and visits that require payments.

In order for this to be achieved communication between all the professionals takes place regularly and when anyone has a concern about a child it is dealt with in an appropriate way.
