Attendance Report

We are trialling a new way of reporting your child's attendance. You will receive a breakdown of your child's attendance in their end of year report detailing the amount of authorised and unauthorised absence, and the number of lates (if any). Definitions of these are listed below. Your child's overall percentage can be matched to the grid to determine our in school attendance rating.

The school's attendance has risen in recent years to above 96% and we are keen to improve this further. We track attendance regularly in school and commend children on their attendance with a weekly class award and 100% attendance awards at the end of the year.

We aim to improve pupils' achievement by ensuring high levels of attendance and punctuality. It is our aim for all children to achieve a minimum of 96% attendance across the year (a maximum of 6 days absence), with exemption given to those with ongoing medical needs and also in other exceptional circumstances. Throughout the year myself, Mrs. Warren and Julie Haskell (the Education Welfare Officer) discuss attendance regularly and may write to you should we have any concerns regarding unnecessary or irregular absence particularly in the week before and after school holidays. We aim to work in partnership with you to ensure consistent attendance to

allow pupils to realise their potential in school.

Definitions

Authorised absence is absence given with a legitimate reason and has notification from a parent/carer. Only the school can decide if the absence is authorised.

An absence is classified as unauthorised when a child is away from school without the permission of the school. Therefore the absence is unauthorised if a child is away from school without good reason, even with the support of a parent.

A child is recorded late if they arrive in school after 09:00. The school gates open at 08:40 and registration begins at 08:50
